Happy Anniversary LMP!



Grant Opportunities!

SB22-160 Rent Stabilization

We're excited to announce changes to the SB160 Rent Stabilization Grant Program. Starting in 2025, the application cycle will transition from a rolling to a quarterly process, giving you more time to plan and submit. Additionally, the grant cap has increased from \$66,000 to \$80,000, providing even more financial support for your community's initiatives.

Better Together Grant Program

Each year, ROC USA offers \$20,000 for community improvement projects, with individual grants up to \$2,000. Eligible projects include safety improvements, rebranding, and leadership development
